

Safeguarding Risk Assessment 2023

CLUB NAME

This Club operates as a provider of a relevant service to children and young people under Section 11 (1) of the Children First Act 2015. Those providing a relevant service must undertake a risk assessment of any potential for harm and abuse that could befall a child while participating in our sporting organisation. In conformity with the requirements of Section 11 (1) of the Children First Act 2015, the risk assessment is based on the risk of abuse to a child and not general health and safety risk. The subsequent Child Safeguarding Statement is based on the completed/updated risk assessment. Mountaineering Ireland affiliated clubs are required to display a Child Safeguarding Statement (Section 11 (1b) Children First Act 2015). This risk assessment has also been developed to ensure adherence to the NI Safeguarding Standards for Children's Sport.

RISK ASSESSMENT INSTRUCTIONS The following risk assessment is pre-populated for review at your club meeting. 2 The risk assessment must be discussed and completed at Committee level. 3 Each identified risk must be assessed and ranked as either Low, Medium or High. 4 As an individual club, you may identify additional risks that are specific to your club. 5 The risk assessment must now be signed by your Chairperson and Club's Children's Officer. 6 The discussion, completion and subsequent signing must be recorded in the minutes of the meeting. 7 Following completion of the risk assessment, please renew and edit your Clubs Child Safeguarding Statement (CSS). 8 As a requirement of the Children First Act 2015, you must display our CSS in a prominent public place in your club facility. The CSS must be visible on your social media platforms.
